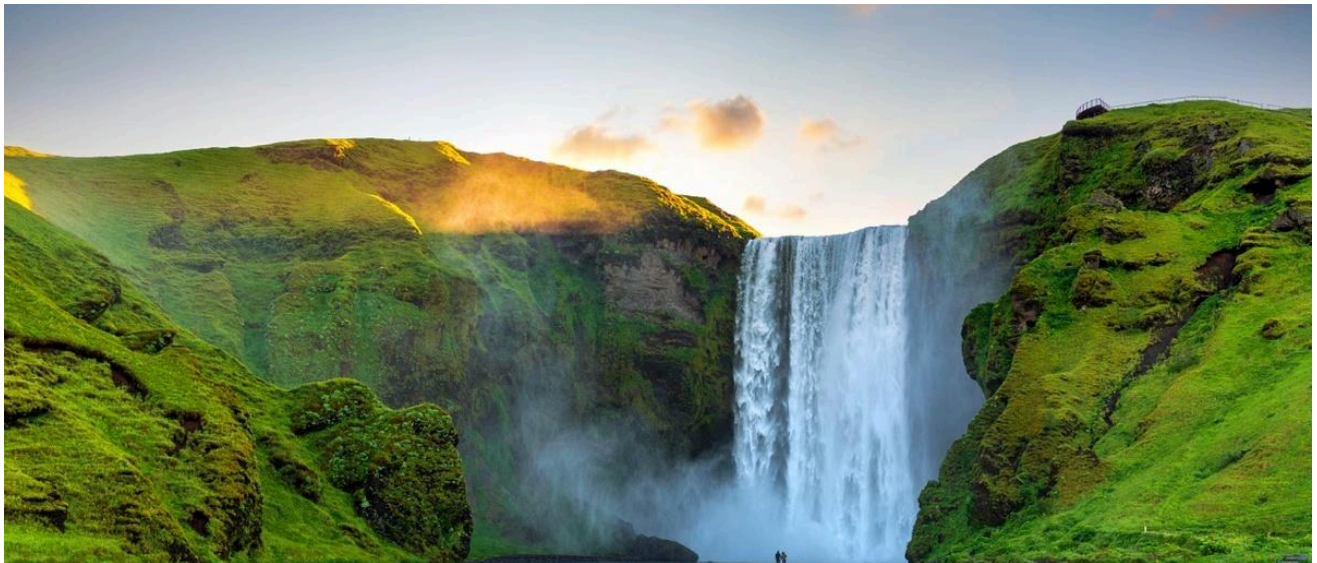

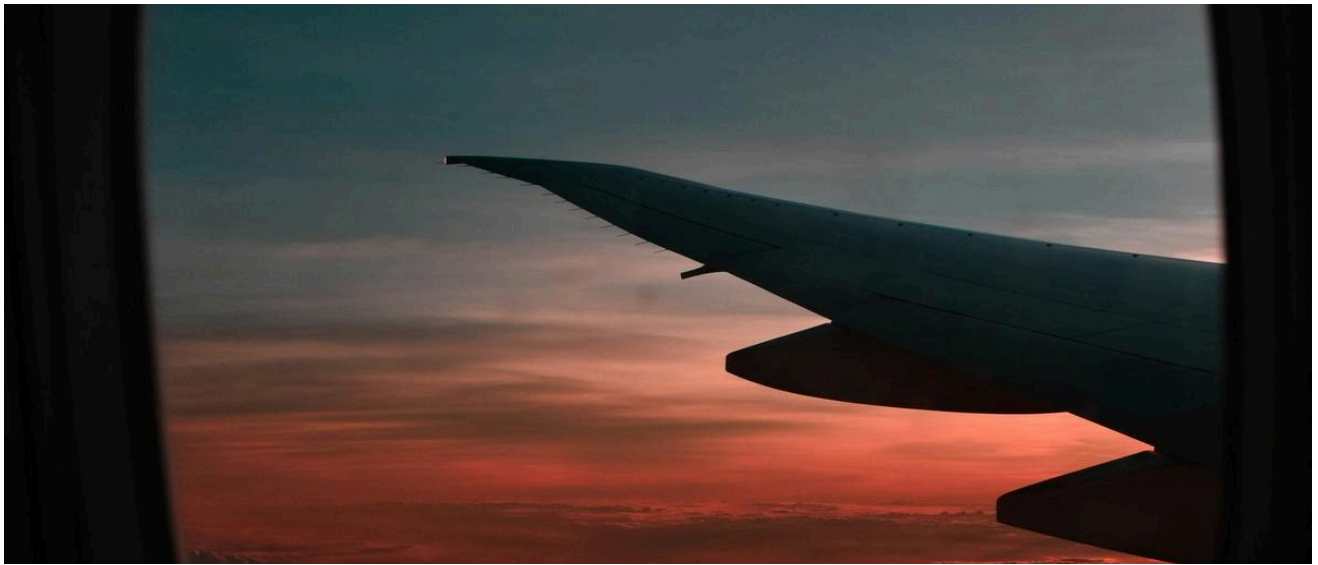
Highlights

- See Reykjavík's highlights and stroll through the Old Town and harbor district, discovering the city's rich history, vibrant culture, and stunning coastal views.
- Explore Iceland's iconic Golden Circle, featuring Þingvellir National Park, the erupting Strokkur geyser at Geysir Geothermal Area, and the breathtaking Gullfoss Waterfall.
- Discover Iceland's stunning South Coast, featuring the majestic waterfalls of Seljalandsfoss and Skógafoss, the black sand beaches of Reynisfjara, and the towering Dyrhólaey Cliffs.
- Walk along Diamond Beach, where glistening ice fragments wash up on the volcanic black sand of Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon.
- Nestled along Iceland's west coast, Borgarnes is a gateway to Viking history and stunning landscapes. Explore the Settlement Center, scenic fjords, volcanic craters, and nearby waterfalls.
- Journey deep inside Langjökull glacier for exclusive access to a stunning man-made ice tunnel, a rare and unforgettable experience.
- Relax in the geothermal waters of the Blue Lagoon, Iceland's famous spa, surrounded by volcanic landscapes. Soak in the mineral-rich, milky-blue waters, enjoy a silica mud mask

Day 1/2 Travel to Iceland

DAY 1: DEPART USA

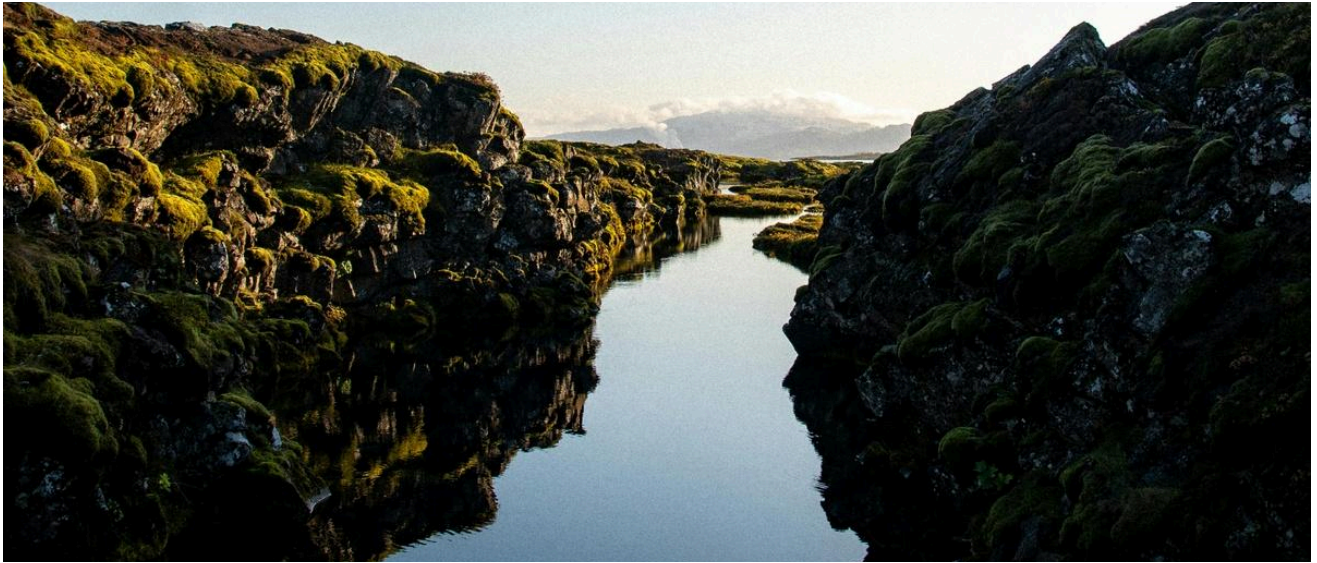
Board your overnight flight to Iceland, beginning your adventure to the land of fire and ice.

DAY 2: ARRIVE ICELAND

Arrive in Reykjavík, Iceland's vibrant capital, and take a guided tour of its highlights. Explore the city's historic landmarks, modern architecture, and scenic waterfront. See notable sites such as Hallgrímskirkja Church, Harpa Concert Hall, and Perlan's observation deck. Enjoy a welcome dinner. Overnight in Reykjavík. (B,D)

DAY 3

THE GOLDEN CIRCLE & ÞINGVELLIR NATIONAL PARK



Day 3: THE GOLDEN CIRCLE & ÞINGVELLIR NATIONAL PARK

Explore the famous Golden Circle, starting with Þingvellir National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site where the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates meet. Learn about Iceland's Viking history as you walk through this geologically stunning rift valley. Continue to the Geysir Geothermal Area, where Strokkur geyser erupts every few minutes. End the day at Gullfoss Waterfall, one of Iceland's most powerful cascades, where glacial meltwater plunges into a rugged canyon. Overnight in Reykjavík. (B)

DAY 4

SOUTH COAST WATERFALLS



Day 4: SOUTH COAST WATERFALLS

Journey along Iceland's spectacular South Coast. Stop at Seljalandsfoss Waterfall, where you can walk behind the cascading water for a unique perspective. Visit the thundering Skógafoss Waterfall, known for its dramatic 200-foot drop and frequent rainbows. Visit the Skógar Museum and discover its turf-built houses and its collection of farm and domestic artifacts. Overnight in Vík. (B,D)

DAY 5

DYRHÓLAEY CLIFFS & SÓLHEIMAJÖKULL GLACIER



Day 5: DYRHÓLAEY CLIFFS & SÓLHEIMAJÖKULL GLACIER

Visit Dyrhólaey Cliffs, a dramatic coastal promontory offering panoramic views of the Atlantic Ocean, black sand beaches, and sea arches. Later, see Sólheimajökull Glacier, part of Iceland's fourth largest ice cap. Take in its dramatic, blue-white ice, rugged crevasses, and stunning views. Walk through Vík village, a charming town known for its remote beauty, and explore Reynisfjara Black Sand Beach, where towering basalt columns and crashing waves create an unforgettable landscape. Overnight in Vík. (B,D)

DAY 6

FJAÐRÁRGLJÚFUR CANYON & JÖKULSÁRLÓN GLACIER LAGOON



Day 6: FJAÐRÁRGLJÚFUR CANYON & JÖKULSÁRLÓN GLACIER LAGOON

Travel east to Fjaðrárgljúfur Canyon, a breathtaking glacial river canyon covered in moss. Take in its winding beauty before continuing to Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon, where massive icebergs drift in crystal-clear waters. Walk along Diamond Beach, where glistening ice fragments wash up on the volcanic black sand. Overnight in Vík. (B,D)

DAY 7

SCENIC DRIVE TO BORGARNES VIA HVALFJÖRÐUR FJORD



Day 7: SCENIC DRIVE TO BORGARNES VIA HVALFJÖRÐUR FJORD

Travel northwest via the picturesque Hvalfjörður Fjord, a scenic detour featuring stunning fjord views, WWII historical sites, and peaceful coastal landscapes. Arrive in Borgarnes, where you'll visit the Settlement Center Museum to learn about Iceland's early Viking settlers. Overnight in Borgarnes. (B,D)

DAY 8

SNÆFELLSNES PENINSULA EXPLORATION



Day 8: SNÆFELLSNES PENINSULA EXPLORATION

Explore the stunning Snæfellsnes Peninsula, often called “Iceland in Miniature” due to its diverse landscapes. Visit Kirkjufell Mountain and Kirkjufellsfoss Waterfall, one of the most photographed sites in Iceland. Walk through the Arnarstapi & Hellnar coastal villages, where dramatic basalt formations meet the ocean. See the Búðakirkja Black Church, a striking historic landmark set against Iceland’s wild terrain. Overnight in Borgarnes. (B,D)

DAY 9

INTO THE GLACIER EXPERIENCE



Day 9: INTO THE GLACIER EXPERIENCE

Go beyond the surface with exclusive access to Langjökull glacier's remarkable ice tunnel—an extraordinary experience few travelers encounter. Walk deep inside the glacier for a rare, up-close look at its brilliant blue ice and ever-changing frozen world. Enjoy the remainder of the day in Borgarnes. Overnight in Borgarnes. (B,D)

DAY 10

RETURN TO REYKJAVÍK & BLUE LAGOON

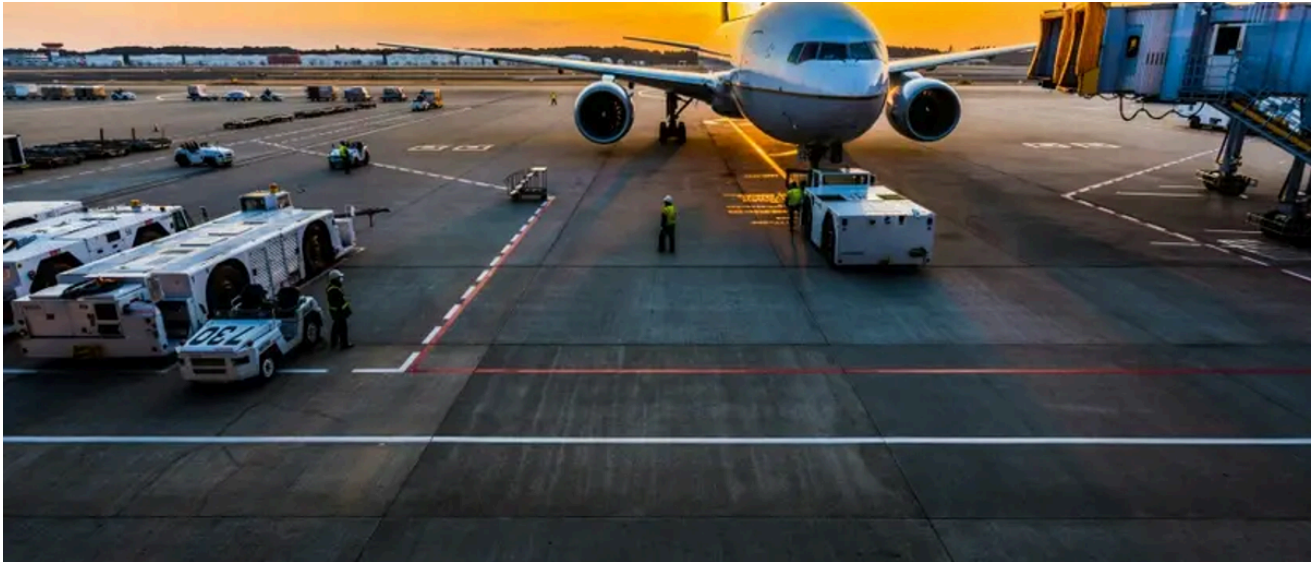


Day 10: RETURN TO REYKJAVÍK & BLUE LAGOON

Head back to Reykjavík to explore the city at your own pace. Later, unwind at the Blue Lagoon, Iceland's world-famous geothermal spa, where you can soak in the mineral-rich, steaming blue waters. Celebrate your adventure with a farewell dinner. Overnight in Reykjavík. (B,D)

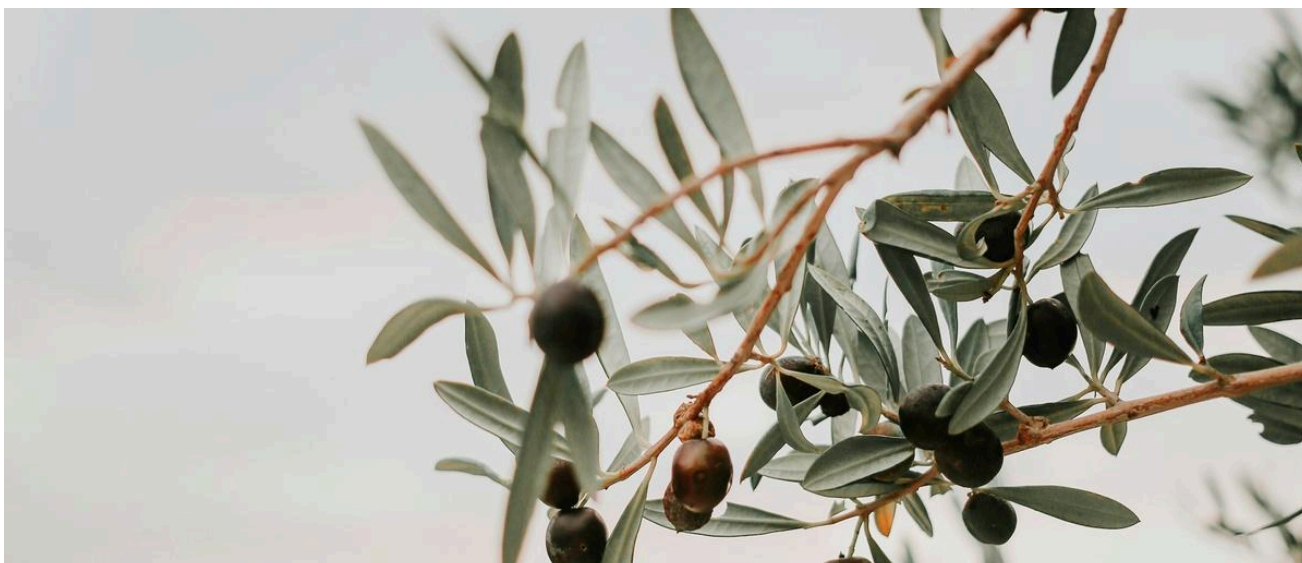

Refunds & Cancellation Fees:

Payments are fully refundable until 150 days before departure. Cancellations must be submitted in writing by certified mail or email to Meridian Guided Travel. After that point, cancellation fees apply according to the fee schedule. If you do not purchase travel protection, the below fees will apply in full. If you do purchase travel protection but cancel for a reason that is not covered by your provider, the same fees will apply.

MGT Cancellation Fee Schedule: Cancellations made up to 150 days before departure receive a full refund. If you cancel 149–120 days before departure, the deposit amount is retained. For cancellations 119–90 days prior, 70% of the total trip price is refunded. For cancellations 89–45 days prior, 50% of the total trip price is refunded. Cancellations made less than 45 days before departure are non-refundable.

TRIP FAQs



GENERAL TOUR INFORMATION

- What is the group size for this tour? This tour is designed for a group ranging from 15 to 28 travelers, ensuring a comfortable and engaging experience.
- Is March a good time to visit Iceland? Absolutely! March offers a stunning blend of winter landscapes and increasing daylight, making it an ideal time for sightseeing, light adventure, and experiencing Iceland's natural wonders with fewer crowds.
- Will we see the Northern Lights? March is one of the best months for Northern Lights viewing! However, the aurora is a natural phenomenon and depends on weather conditions. We include multiple opportunities in remote, low-light areas to increase the chances of sightings.
- What is the weather like in March? Expect temperatures between 28–38°F. Conditions can change quickly, so layers are key to staying comfortable. March may bring snow, rain, wind, or sunshine—all in one day!
- Where will we stay? Comfortable modern hotels (3-4 star). We stay multiple nights in key locations to reduce frequent hotel changes.
- Are meals included? The tour includes daily breakfasts, and select dinners including a welcome and a farewell dinner in Reykjavík. Other meals will be at your own expense, allowing you to explore Icelandic cuisine.
- Can dietary restrictions be accommodated? Yes! Icelandic restaurants can accommodate vegetarian, vegan, gluten-free, and other dietary needs with advance



notice.

•How will we get around? Travel is in a comfortable, climate controlled coach with large windows for scenic viewing.

•What is the physical activity level of this tour? This is a moderate activity tour. Expect to walk on uneven terrain, icy paths, and gravel trails. Some optional hikes are included, but alternatives are available for those who prefer lighter activity.

•What currency is used in Iceland? Iceland uses the Icelandic Króna (ISK). However, credit cards are widely accepted, even for small purchases.

•Is Iceland safe? Yes! Iceland is one of the safest countries in the world, with low crime rates and well-maintained roads.

•Do I need travel insurance? Travel insurance is highly recommended.
